#### WHAT DO ADMISSION COUNSELORS CONSIDER HIGHLY IMPORTANT?

- 84% Grades in College Prep Courses
- 68% Strength of Curriculum
- 59% SAT/ACT scores
- 24% Essay
- 21% Demonstrated Interest
- 19% Counselor Recommendation
- 16% Teacher Recommendations
- 6% Interview
- 5% SAT Subject Tests and AP exam scores
- 5% Extracurricular Resume



#### SOME HISTORICAL DATA...

- Northeastern University:
  - 1990: 10,300 of 10,600 applicants were admitted
  - 2018: 19% admit rate

#### **VANDERBILT ACCEPTANCE RATES**

Since 1999, Vanderbilt University has become more selective in the number of prospective students it accepts. At a projected 12.5 percent this year, the acceptance rate would again mark an all-time low.



#### ROLE OF THE STUDENT

- Assume responsibility for the process
- Focus on academics
- Keep an open mind
- Do Loomis Well

#### ROLE OF THE PARENT

- Focus on the things you can control and maximize your efforts in those areas (offer campus visits, organize test prep)
- Ask questions there are no wrong, dumb, inappropriate questions in this process (Except "Is that a GOOD school?")
- Attend workshops and parent programs
- Encourage student to own the process
- Educate yourself on the climate of college admissions in 2020

#### AND REMEMBER...

- Loomis students typically do very well
- Nationally, most students won't end up at their I<sup>st</sup> choice school, but most students will LOVE the college they end up attending (UCLA Study)
- Students who enter into this process with a focus on self-exploration, research and fit end with a very high level of satisfaction with the process
